
The difference in overall achievement of girls and boys is not significant. Both genders are generally achieving well, with a higher percentage of girls achieving at or above and boys achieving 10% lower overall. However, 12% more boys achieved well above.

Raising Māori and Pacific Peoples student achievement in the English medium strands remains a focus. Teachers have support in place for these students, including specific interventions.

There are 19 children achieving below expectation and 9 children achieving well below expectation. 10 are in the Montessori strand and 18 are in the Original strand. The year levels with the most learners below expectation are year 5 (8/23) and year 7 (4/10).


Of the students who are *well below*, three are receiving ESOL support, one is ORS funded (Ongoing Resourcing Scheme - high needs), four are receiving extra support through the SEG grant (Special Education Grant), one is receiving ICS (In Classroom Support) funding and one has a full-time teacher aide, funded through a donation. Of those who are *below*, three are receiving Reading Recovery, one is receiving LLI (Language Learning Intervention), one is receiving ICS and one is ESOL funded. There are also students in this group receiving private literacy tuition at school. The rest will receive support through the classroom programme and extra teacher support intervention strategies.

The graphs that follow each learning area commentary show the numbers of children achieving overall, in each gender, within selected ethnic groups and within each year level



Reading SOY - 2022 - Pie Chart









Reading SOY - 2022 - Pie Chart

Split By: Gender



Writing:

68% of current students were assessed as at or above expectation in Writing at the end of 2021 and 32% below to well below.

Well above expectation: 8%Above expectation: 12%

Total above expectation: 20%

At expectation: 48%Below expectation: 22%

Well below expectation: 9%

Girls are generally achieving better than boys in writing, with 73% at or above to 65% at or above. Both genders are achieving equally in being above to well above the expectation, with 11% more boys in the well above category. There are 27% of girls below to well below and 35% of boys. Boys still lag behind the girls in writing achievement, however what this shows is that we need to raise achievement in writing for both genders.

A greater number of Māori students were assessed as *below to well below* in writing than *at or above* and Pacific People's achievement is split between the two. This contrasts with over 70% of NZ European/Pakeha/other European achieving *at or above*.

Providing further context, it is important to note that of the 7 Māori students below to well below, 4 are receiving some form of MoE funded learning intervention and of the 5 Pacific People's students below to well below, 3 are receiving ESOL support. Teachers also have support in place for these students, including specific interventions.

Overall there are 24 children achieving *below* expectation and 10 children achieving *well below* expectation. 11 children are in the Montessori strand and 23 are in the Original strand. The year levels with the most learners below expectation in writing are year 5 (8/23) and year 7 (4/10). Years 4, 5 and 7 have significant numbers.


Of the students who are *below to well below,* 15 are receiving some form of Ministry learning support intervention (such as those described previously in the Reading report.) There are also students in this group receiving private literacy tuition at school and a school donation funded teacher aide. The rest will receive support through the classroom programme and extra teacher support intervention strategies.









Writing SOY - 2022 - Pie Chart

Split By: Gender



Mathematics:

75% of current students were assessed as at or above expectation in Reading at the end of 2021 and 24% below to well below.

• Well above expectation: 5%

Above expectation: 14%

Total above expectation: 19%

• At expectation: 56%

Below expectation: 21%

Well below expectation: 4%

The difference in overall achievement between girls and boys is apparent in the *above to well above* range and in the *at to well above* range. 16% more boys are achieving *above to well above* expectation and 15% more boys are achieving *at to well above* expectation. There are 57 girls and 19 of them (25%) are achieving *below to well below* expectation in mathematics. There are 60 boys and 11 of them (18%) are achieving *below to well below* expectation in mathematics.

Raising Māori and Pacific Peoples student achievement in the English medium strands remains a focus for mathematics as it does for other areas. Teachers have support in place for these students, including specific interventions. Shani Leda delivers twice weekly mathematics lessons for small groups of students.

Of the 25 children achieving below expectation and the 5 children achieving well below expectation, 10 are in the Montessori strand and 21 are in the Original strand. The year level with the most learners below expectation is year 4 (9/21).

Of the students who are below to well below, 10 are receiving some form of government funded learning support intervention and 1 has a non government funded full-time teacher aide.



Math SOY - 2022 - Pie Chart









Math SOY - 2022 - Pie Chart


