
#### Kelly Sports Is Back This July 2023 With The Ever Popular Football Holiday Programme!

- I. The Entrance & Exhibition Building, opened in 2014, has a reception/retail area, exhibition gallery and collection room. The exhibition area acts as an introduction to the museum and village, showcasing a number of the larger and significant objects in our collection. The facility allows the Cobblestones Trust to protect, maintain and preserve the integrity of the Museum's unique Heritage collection.
- 2. The Donald Woolshed is an early purpose-built Wairarapa woolshed (c. 1870), moved from Masterton to Cobblestones Museum in 1973. The building shows the shearing floor and machinery, the wool sorting bench and displays a 'Donald Donald' patented wool press. A Category 2 listed building.\*
- 3. The Cobblestones Forge shows the process of making horseshoes.
- 4. The Fire Station houses a fire engine and equipment from the 1940s and 1950s.
- 5. The Old Wesleyan (Methodist) Church was opened at 63 Main St, Greytown in October 1865 by the town's early settlers. This is likely the oldest purpose built church in the Wairarapa. This church has social significance as each Christian denomination represented in Greytown at the time contributed to its construction. It then housed their services until other congregations were able to build their own buildings. Timber for the church was milled locally at Udy's Mill. A Category 2 listed building.\*
- 6. The Printing Works displays the presses, typefaces and other machinery used by a typical early 1900s job print works.
- 7. The Mangapakeha School opened in 1902 at Mangapakeha (near Masterton). As a one-teacher school, it catered for students from 5 to 12 years, as illustrated by the varying desk sizes. A Category 2 listed building.\*
- 8. Roadman's Hut & Fruit Shed
- 9. The First Wairarapa Hospital was opened in Greytown on 17 July 1875. It shows a typical ward, doctor's consulting room and dispensary. A Category 2 listed building.\*
- 10. The Administration Building is available for hire and is popular with craft and small community groups.
- 11. The Machinery Building houses a wide range of stationary engines, chaff cutters & ancillary farm machinery.

  12. The Coach House displays horse drawn vehicles. The centrepiece is 'The Pride of The Valley' passenger coach, used prior to 1919 to carry passengers from the rail-head at Featherston to Martinborough. The coach, pulled by Clydesdales, is used occasionally for parades and events in Greytown. The display also includes horse-drawn gigs, and tradesmen's wagons.

13. The Colonial Cottage was believed to have been built by Mr Hugh O'Connor around 1867 and was one of two located on a section to the north of St Luke's Church, Greytown. It is thought to be made from timber milled north of the town. A Category 2 listed building.\*

14. The Hastwell Stables were erected and their distinctive cobblestones laid on this site in 1857. They originally formed part of the complex of several stables and a blacksmith shop. Up until 1880, the horse drawn coaches departed from here for Wellington with Cobb & Co and to settlements in the Wairarapa with Hastwell Coaches. Up to 70 horses were grazed overnight on the site while the coachmen enjoyed the hospitality of the Rising Sun Hotel across the road. A Category 2 listed building.\*

\* Listed as an historically significant building with Heritage New Zealand.

Cobblestones Museum is operated and maintained by volunteers. It was established in 1969 by the Jaycee organisation and today is administered by the Cobblestones Trust with valuable support from the Friends of Cobblestones. Funding, maintenance and the development of significant displays that are of an educational and historical benefit to the wider Wairarapa community are dependent on donations, subscriptions, entry fees, bequests and grants.
