**Literacy Quiz** - Congratulations to our Literacy Quiz participants who competed with 60 other schools in the Wellington Literacy Quiz last week. Two teams were entered from Otari School. One team placed 5<sup>th</sup> and the other team placed 21<sup>st</sup>. The top 5 teams were:

## **2016 Ngā Whanaketanga and National Standards Results -**

### **Tuhituhi/Writing - a continuing focus**

In each of the strands - Montessori, Original and Māori Immersion - our analysis reveals that Writing and Tuhituhi have proven to be an area for continued emphasis to accelerate the learning of identified students.

In the Māori Immersion Strand 60% of students from year 2 to year 8 achieved 'at' or 'above' the Tuhituhi Standard at the end of 2016. There is no significant difference between boys and girls.

In the Original and Montessori strands 74% of students achieved 'at' or 'above' the Writing Standard at the end of 2016. When comparing genders, 80% of girls achieved 'at' or 'above' the standard compared with 67% of boys. There is only a 3% difference between boys and girls achieving 'above' the standard.

The tuhituhi results indicated that despite many students entering with limited te reo Māori the majority are learning to write successfully in te reo Māori by the time they are in their senior years at school. This finding is supported by the fact that all year 8 students achieved at or above the tuhituhi standard at the end of 2016.

This pattern of writing results improving over time is also apparent in the Original and Montessori Strands, with 91% of students in year 8 achieving 'at' or 'above' the National Standard.

While writing is an area for continued focus, results also showed that 26 students had lifted their OTJ (Overall Teacher Judgement) placement since 2015.
