Nau mai, haere mai ki te Kura o Otari

Their joyful engagement in the camp experiences was a pleasure to witness.

2017 Charter Goals - Each week the newsletter will contain information about the Annual Plan. This week we focus on the Charter goals related to Curriculum Implementation and Student Engagement.

Curriculum Implementation and Student Engagement Goals:

1 Review and develop a revised English plan and a revised Te Reo Matatini plan

Using staff feedback, and incorporating identified teaching priorities, the Principal will work with Sue Corkill (curriculum consultant, editor and publisher) to review current plans and draft new documents that reflect Otari School practice. Following further feedback, a final plan will be edited and published.

2 Teachers will develop in-depth understanding of the writing and mathematics aspects of *The Pact Tool*

Teachers will further explore the Writing aspects in Term 1 and 2 and the mathematics aspects in Terms 3 and 4. They will inquire into the aspects to identify programme gaps and teaching priorities. Plans will be made to address these gaps. A Teacher Only Day that focuses on Mathematics PLD will contribute to this. Internal staff and syndicate PLD will be a feature of this work.

3 Teachers will strengthen their skills for using and integrating digital technology effectively within their teaching programmes.

A term 1 Teacher Only Day is planned at Mind Lab focussed on Coding and Electronics and their use across the curriculum. Resources will be purchased to support this development and teachers will use these within the classroom and share how they are being effectively used.

4 Successfully implement Otari School te reo Māori curriculum plan

The Montessori and Original Strand classes will effectively deliver Level 1 of Arataki Marau mō te Ako i Te Reo.

5 Continue to develop the teaching skill and expertise to more effectively lift achievement in pangarau

Effective PLD will be provided based on individual teachers PLD needs. The Māori Immersion Strand will be involved in the mid year teacher only day focused on mathematics, run by Charlotte Wilkinson.

Student Achievement - This week we focus on the Pānui (reading) achievement of students in the Māori Immersion Strand in relation to Ngā Whanaketanga - The National Standards for Māori Medium Education.

2016 Māori Immersion Ngā Whanaketanga Pānui Results

Pānui

Pānui achievement shows that 34/47 ākonga (learners) in the Māori Immersion Strand met or exceeded expectation at the end of 2016. This means 72% of ākonga achieved 'manawa ora' (at) or 'manawa toa' (above) the Ngā Whanaketanga expectation. 13% of these tamariki achieved 'manawa toa'.

Results show a variance between the achievement of ngā kotiro (girls) and ngā tama (boys) achievement with 65% of ngā kotiro achieving 'at' or 'above' the expectation compared to 78% of ngā tama.

There is considerable variance in te reo Maori language acquisition of new entrants in the Māori Immersion strand. All children are learning to read in a second language, therefore this understanding needs to be brought to mind when looking at Māori Immersion te reo matatini (literacy) achievement data. We celebrate the fact that most children in the Māori Immersion strand are learning to read well in Te Reo Māori.

Kaiako will continue to address the learning needs of all ākonga throughout the strand and will implement a range of strategies to lift the achievement of the 13 ākonga (28%) who are still working towards the whanaketanga expectation.

These results vary slightly from the official results that are provided for the Ministry of Education as I have not included data of students who have special needs.

Governance: The legislation that governs school Board of Trustees requires the Board to reelect the Chair at the first meeting every year.
