Hall update - Yesterday our BoT Chair, Catherine Thompson and I met with Ministry officials to have initial talks about the hall fire and the process going forward. This involves evaluating the extent of damage and then starting a re-building project. We have established that the entire roof will need to be replaced.

Until there is a hall to move into, Totara and Kereru will stay in their current rooms. All going well, we hope they can move at the start of next year and the refurbishing of their rooms can begin. The Ministry did discuss with us the possibility of re-locatable classrooms but locating them on our site would be a challenge. Therefore the first option is to get a project up and running to fix the hall as soon as we can.

We have let all groups who use the hall know that it is not available. After School Care is operating from the Māori Immersion Strand for the rest of the year. I am liaising with the Trust and will let them know when the hall is able to be entered to retrieve any items they need. The sudden re-location of this important community organisation creates challenges and I know the support of parents and caregivers with children at After School Care is appreciated by the Trust and supervisors during this time.

Great support - We have received great support from the community. Your messages and offers of help are most appreciated. I talked with Jo Fullelove yesterday and the fair will definitely still be going ahead, however your involvement in this will be even more gratefully received. If you have not done so already please let Jo know if you are able to contribute in some way. Encourage as many people as you can to come to the fair.

We have also received wonderful support from our Western Zone cluster schools. Cardinal McKeefry School principal, Tania Savage, is happy for us to use their school hall for our year 8 leavers' evening. Therefore, this will still go ahead on 14 December at 6pm, but at Cardinal McKeefry School. I also had offers of space from Wadestown School and St Theresa's. Wadestown School are shouting our staff morning tea. We are touched by this kindness.

**ERO** - I received notification from the Education Review Office yesterday that they will be visiting us on 12-16 February, week 3 of 2018.

Some good news! - We received news that Britta Martini will be able to train as a Reading Recovery teacher next year. This means we will retain the excellent tutoring provided by Kathy Heath as well as be able to train another teacher, thus significantly increasing the number of children who can benefit from the programme.

Britta will still be teaching a class, however another teacher will need to share this responsibility with her to enable the training and tutoring of students to take place. I will update parents once an appointment has been made.
