OTARI SCHOOL ENROLMENT JULY 2015 – JULY 2016

Otari School Board of Trustees is limited in the number of places it is able to offer students as a consequence of operating an enrolment scheme, details of which are available at the school office.

The Board has determined that there are limited spaces available, including those spaces available within the special programme (Māori Immersion) for out of zone students starting school in terms 3 and 4 of 2015, or during 2016. **Priority will be given to those children turning 5 between 1 July 2015 and 1 July 2016.**

For out of zone students seeking enrolment at Otari School in 2015 or in 2016, the deadline for receipt of applications is **Friday 15 May 2015**. Applicants will be notified of the outcome of applications on or before **Friday 22 May**.

If the number of out of zone applicants exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot following the Ministry of Education defined priority order. If a ballot for out of zone places is required it will be held on **Monday 18 May**. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within five days of it being held.

Closing date for enrolment application: **Friday 15 May**

Ballot date: **Monday 18 May**

Applicants notified: **On or before Friday 22 May**
